The Nanomaterials for Optoelectronics Group, led by Prof. Dr. Jana Zaumseil at Heidelberg University, is pleased to announce an exciting opportunity for a Master's thesis project. We invite motivated and enthusiastic candidates to join our team for a master project on developing, building, and testing a new setup for near-infrared charge modulation spectroscopy at cryogenic temperatures. The aim is to characterize and understand the absorption and emission signatures of excitons and trions (charged excitons) in weakly to moderately doped one-dimensional semiconducting single-walled carbon nanotubes.

The project will be conducted within the framework of the Collaborative Research Center 1225 ISOQUANT.

Requirements

- Enrollment in a Master's program in Physics or Chemistry at Heidelberg University
- Some hands-on experience with optical spectroscopy or optoelectronics devices
- Interest in building new optical setups including their integration with software (e.g., Python, Labview)
- Good communication skills (English, German)
